TERM DATES

Spring Term 2018

The Spring Term 2018 begins on Thursday 4 January and ends on Wednesday 28 March. Half term is from Monday 12 February to Friday 16 February.

Please note that school will also be closed to pupils on Friday 9 February for a staff INSET day.

Summer Term 2018

The Summer Term 2018 begins on Monday 23 April and ends on Friday 6 July. Half term is from Monday 28 May to Friday 1 June.

Autumn Term 2018

The Autumn Term 2018 begins on Monday 3 September and ends on Friday 14 December. Half term is from Friday 19 October to Monday 29 October inclusive. *Please note the extended half term in 2018 includes both Friday 19 and Monday 29 October.*

Spring Term 2019

The Spring Term 2019 begins on Thursday 3 January and ends on Friday 29 March. Half term is from Monday 18 February to Friday 22 February.

Please note that school will also be closed to pupils on Friday 15 February for a staff INSET day.

Summer Term 2019

The Summer Term 2019 begins on Wednesday 24 April and ends on Friday 5 July. Half term is from Monday 27 May to Friday 31 May.

Whilst every effort is made to ensure that dates remain unchanged, we reserve the right to make adjustments if circumstances require.

Please note, however, that the last day of each Spring Term is a full school day, i.e. Pre-Prep children ending at 3.15/3.25 p.m., Prep and Senior pupils at 4.00/4.10 p.m. and 4.55 p.m. for Sixth Form students who have Lesson 8.

The last day before every October, February and May/June half term break is also a <u>full</u> school day.

Pupils are required to remain in school throughout term time and permission for absence for extended holidays to accommodate cheaper air fares, co-ordinate holidays with siblings at other schools etcetera cannot be granted, nor is it permissible to collect your child early from his/her classroom. Parents must also ensure that sufficient time is factored into arrangements to allow time to travel to the airport/Eurostar to check in on time.

Please be reminded that parents are asked to book non-urgent medical and dental appointments for their children outside of school hours or during the half-term and end-of-term holidays to prevent disruption to the school day.

SPRING TERM PARENTS' EVENINGS AND REPORTS

Parents' Evenings are staggered throughout the Autumn, Spring and Summer Terms. The Harrodian uses an annual cycle of Parents' Evenings, reports and grade cards to communicate to you your child's academic progress, with the schedule of reporting and feedback published by term in our regular bulletins.

Spring Term reports will be sent out for all pupils in the 13s, 15s and Lower Sixth and Progress Reports for pupils in the 11s, 12s, 14s and Upper Sixth.

Spring Term Parents' Evenings

Parents are asked to note that children may not be in school after 5.00 p.m. as we are unable to offer supervision. **Children may not play or run around indoors/outdoors**. Please therefore make alternative arrangements for your children's care. The only exception is if your child is returning late from a sports fixture/after-school club. He/She may then sit quietly reading or doing homework, but if disruptive, you will be asked to take your child home.



Some Christmas reading suggestions from books I've particularly enjoyed recently ...



<u>**Testosterone Rex</u>** is honestly superb! It was the Royal Society science book of the year. It was praised for "its eye-opening, forensic look at gender stereotypes and its urgent call for change." Her argument is that the differences between the sexes are cultural and societal rather than biological. That makes it sound dry, but it was easy to read and had a surprising number of jokes.</u>

Another non-fiction book I really enjoyed, although that might be a bad choice of words, was <u>This is Going to Hurt</u> by Adam Kay. It certainly isn't for the faint-hearted and I would only suggest older readers attempt it, but I alternated between horrified laughter and being on the edge of tears as I read this. We have a number of aspiring medics in the Sixth Form and I will be recommending this book to them.




I love Ben Aaronovitch and we have a number of fans of the series amongst the students. <u>A Rare</u> <u>Book of Cunning Device</u> is an audio exclusive and I listened to it while walking one evening. The dog walkers must have thought I was crazy as I walked

along chuckling. I also enjoyed his latest book <u>*The Furthest*</u> <u>*Station*</u> which is only a novella, so perfect for a cup of tea and a biscuit and an hour's relaxation.

I must also recommend audio books. Listening to a book is different from reading a book, but a good narrator can add such a lot to a work. For reluctant readers, readers with too little time, or anyone who walks or runs, they can be fabulous. This autumn I've had Robert Harris' <u>*Cicero*</u> series and <u>*Silent*</u> <u>*Child*</u> by Sara A Denzil to keep me company as I try to improve my 'parkrun' times. With both of these, I will admit to walking past my house and round the block to find out what happened next!

SCHOOL NURSE

Immunisations:

Booster vaccinations for tetanus, diphtheria, polio and meningitis (Men ACWY) will be offered to all pupils in the 13s on 28 February 2018. Information and consent forms will be sent out at the beginning of the Spring Term and are to be returned as soon as possible.

If your child is in the 14s or above, has not yet had this vaccination and you would like him/her to receive it, please contact me.

The 12s first HPV vaccination will be given in June 2018, with the second the following academic year. If your daughter has not received this vaccination and you would like her to, please contact me via the email address below.

Medication:

If your child is taking medication, it must please be given to me in the Nurse's Office, in the original packaging, with clear instructions for administration.

Pupils should not be carrying any medication other than throat sweets, inhalers and, in the Senior School, their Epipens.

Please contact me on the email below if you have any queries about this.

Nuts and Sesame:

Please be aware that the school aims to provide a nut free and sesame free environment. We have pupils with severe nut and sesame allergies, so it is imperative that no pupils bring snacks / food / birthday cakes containing nuts, sesame or nut/sesame ingredients. Likewise, please ensure all cakes brought in for cake sales contain no nuts/sesame or traces of nuts or sesame.

Please be vigilant when providing break-time snacks and 'health' bars to ensure they are nut/sesame free by checking food labels carefully. For treats for birthdays etcetera, please note that Haribo sweets are a safer alternative to chocolate – Cadbury's chocolate is not completely safe for those suffering from nut allergies, but Kit Kats and Maltesers provide good alternatives.
