NOTE: Following the Sarah Everard case and issues raised by the Everyone's Invited website, we have this year run a series of specific sessions on Male Behaviour and Female Safety. This began with a PSHRE form time session, followed by specific boy-only and girl-only talks/discussions with a chance for girls to share feedback. A team of 18 Sixth Form volunteers then received training over the Easter holidays and will help lead 13s Citizenship lessons on this topic during the week following our return. 14s and 15s will then receive special assemblies run in part by the Sixth Form before breaking into workshops during Period 1.

In each of these classes and workshops, the focus will be on working through specific Case Studies in small groups, focussing upon how those involved would be feeling and how they should behave in each situation.

The end result of these sessions will be an agreed Code of Conduct regarding healthy interaction among Harrodian pupils in the Senior School.
