HEADLINES

- 98% of Harroddian A Level students succeeded in entering their first choice or insurance offer university in the UK, USA, Canada or Europe
- Approximately 73% of UK University destinations are Russell Group Universities
- 3 of the 78 students going to university are studying abroad: The University of Chicago (USA), McGill University (Canada) and Delft University of Technology (Netherlands).
- Two students were awarded scholarships - a Physics Scholarship at Royal Holloway, University of London to read Astrophysics and a Peter J. Buckley Achievement International Business Scholarship
- Most popular UK destinations: University of Bath (x8), UCL (x6), University of Warwick (x5), University of Exeter (x 5), King’s College London (x 5), Queen Mary University of London (x 5), University of Bristol (x 4)
- Highlight UK destinations: University of Cambridge (Engineering), University of Oxford (English), UCL (Civil Engineering, Italian and Management Studies, Medicine, Russian and Spanish, Archaeology, Politics, Sociology and East European Studies), Durham University (Natural Sciences), University of St Andrews (Philosophy and Theological Studies), and University of Bath (Biochemistry x2, Business, Economics, Psychology, Economics and Mathematics, Economics)
- Most popular subject areas: Science/STEM/Medicine (x 11), Business/Finance/Management (x 10), Psychology (x8), Economics (x8), Engineering (x5), and History/Politics/International Relations (x 6)
