# HEADLINES

- 91% of Harrodian A Level students succeeded in entering their first choice or insurance offer university in the UK, USA, Canada or Europe and 29 of them will be taking a gap year/deferred entry
- Approximately 63% of UK University destinations are Russell Group Universities
- 10% of students going to university are studying abroad: American University, Barnard College, ESCP Business School, Georgetown University, IE Business School Madrid, McGill University, Miami University and NYU
- 10% of students going to university are studying at Creative/Performing Arts/Music colleges/universities: Arts University Bournemouth, Central Film School London, Courtauld Institute of Art, Institute of Contemporary Music, RADA and University of the Arts London amongst others
- Most popular UK destinations: University of Bristol (x13), The University of Manchester (x7), University of Exeter (x6), University of Edinburgh (x 6), University of Leeds (x 5), Newcastle University (x 4), and The University of Nottingham (x 4)
- Most popular subject areas for degree: Medicine/Science/STEM including Engineering and Architecture (x 14), Business/Economics/Management/Finance (x 14), International Business/Management (x8), History/Politics/International Relations/Law (x 7), and Sport Management/Coaching/Exercise Science (x4)
